
From our base in Staffin, Isle of Skye, Organic Sea Harvest is a leading producer of the finest farmed Scottish organic salmon.



Why Farm In North-East Skye? The Environment

We choose to farm in North-East Skye, not because it's easy but because the wild waters and fantastic people are great for our fish and our business.






Why do we Need Two New Farms?

Our business plan always required a minimum of four farm sites in North-East Skye. We need this many sites to enable us to build a sustainable business for the future. Most importantly we need four farm sites to:

- Ensure we provide our fish with the best possible farming conditions.
- Enable us to farm in balance with the natural environment, regularly fallowing our sites to help minimize our impacts.
- Be able to provide a consistent supply of healthy seafood to our customers.
